IV. Arbor Good Neighbor House (AGNH) Updates: Peter Morris

- A. Working to Make Community Connections
 - 1. Used to be a church, but now a community center
 - 2. There are many volunteer opportunities
 - 3. Includes a preschool
 - 4. Good Neighbor House Personal Essentials Pantry
 - 5. Repair Café on November 22, 2:00-4:00 pm: where "handy" folks (volunteers) help others fix stuff; if you have anything broken, bring it to the Café!
- B. Contact Peter Morris if you are interested in using the Arbor Good Neighbor House to host community events, courses, etc.

V. Community Policing in Arbor Hills: South District Captain Harrison Zanders; Neighborhood Resource Officer Mitch Favor

- A. Focused on Outreach Efforts
 - 1. There are 50-plus outreach efforts
 - 2. Looking at root causes and what is causing issues in the district
 - 3. Housing issues
 - 4. Domestic issues (provides resources and guidance); partner with DAIS (Domestic Abuse Intervention Services)
 - 5. Many efforts focused on Leopold Elementary School and Leopold Park
 - 6. Discussed a handout brought to the meeting: Property Crime You Can Help Prevent It

VI. District 10 Alder: Yannette Figueroa Cole

- A. Updates
 - 1. Budget update: Dane County will have a 4% cut; City of Madison \$31 million deficit
 - The water project centered around Todd Drive will be completed in a couple of weeks

- 3. Discussed speed bumps on Grandview Boulevard (brought up by concerned individuals attending the meeting)

VII. Cherokee Middle School Principal: Robert Moreno

A. Update

- 1. A Fun Run was held on October 1; over \$27,000 was raised! When the community comes together, money can be raised
- 2. Since he has been principal, the number of incidents has greatly decreased
- B. New School (approved with 2024 Referendum)
 - 1. There are plans to build a new school on the current school site/property
- C. What We Can Do as a Community
 - 1. Principal Moreno asked people to visit the Cherokee Facebook page and to "spread the word" about Cherokee events/updates
 - 2. Tutors are always needed

VIII. Madison School & Community Recreation (MSCR) Executive Director: Mary Roth

- A. Updates
 - 1. MSCR is part of the Madison school district (where their funding comes from)
 - 2. There is programming for all interests, all ages
 - 3. Three catalogs per year are developed; the next one comes out a week before Thanksgiving
- B. Serving Communities
 - 1. A survey will be sent in the near future asking for feedback on how MSCR can better serve the community

IX. Madison LakeWay Partners, Inc.: CEO Jayme Powers

- A. Madison LakeWay Updates
 - 1. The project will create a beautiful gateway park blending city life with greenspace
 - 2. Located on John Nolen Drive: 1.7 miles of public lakeshore stretching from Law Park to Olin Park along the edge of Lake Monona
 - 3. Currently, the space is underutilized
 - 4. Jayme showed a video describing the project, and also had a handout with project information
- B. Timeline
 - 1. The project will be done in phases; as money is raised, more development will take place
 - 2. The first section will be completed by the winter of 2028
