Meet the Goodmans!

The year was 1991 and Brian and Cheryl Goodman were in search of a bigger house for their growing family, which now included their 3 and 5 year old daughters, Ashley and Rachael. Their house in the Westmorland neighborhood was nice, but they wanted more space to grow. Their one requirement was staying in the West High School attendance area. A friend recommended the Arbor Hills neighborhood. They fell in love with the trees, the nearby park, the proximity to the Arboretum - and a house they could afford that was perfect for their family.

Cheryl came to Madison for college from the small central Wisconsin town of Colby (fun fact: Colby cheese was invented in the 1800s in Colby, WI). Brian grew up in Gainesville, FL and Syracuse, NY - attending SUNY at Albany, and then came to UW-Madison for graduate school to earn a PhD. 

Arbor Good Neighbor House is Buzzing with Activity

As many of you recall from previous newsletter articles, the Arbor Good Neighbor House (AGNH) is a thriving hub of activity located at 2509 McDivitt Road. It is fulfilling its mission of connecting neighbors and providing common ground for community interaction. AGNH activities are expanding and reaching more and more people. You could be one of them! All this right here in Arbor Hills! What an asset for our neighborhood. Current partners include: Memorial UCC, Creek Day School, Madison Refugee Union, Open Doors for Refugees, All Saints Lutheran Church, Commonwealth Development, Good Neighbors Personal Essentials Pantry, Jewish Social Services, the African American/Jewish Friendship Group, and the AGNH Community Garden.

A sampling of recent activities at Arbor Good Neighbor House includes:

- Holding two Repair Cafés where people can bring in household items to get fixed at no cost by volunteer “fixers” who like to use their skills in a fun and casual setting. The next Repair Café is March 15, 1-4 p.m. See our website (agnh.org) for upcoming dates.
- Providing a venue for Jewish Social Services to hold their periodic International Markets featuring crafts and treats from around the world.
- Hosting an Easter Egg Hunt for a group of children from Arbor Hills
- Hosting the Arbor Hills Neighborhood Association Annual Meeting
- Offering meeting space for Open Doors for Refugees, Jewish Social Services, The Madison Refugee Union, Brave Conversations (a group that gathers to engage in brave conversations about the crisis in Israel and Palestine), Returned Peace Corp Volunteers and others. **Does your group need a meeting or event space?** Check the website at agnh.org for info on how to make a room reservation request. - Hosting a benefit concert for AGNH in December, 2024 featuring Common Chord and Nelson Graham. This concert attracted 125 - 140 people and was received with great enthusiasm.

Our Personal Essentials pantry continues to serve hundreds of households by providing personal and household hygiene products. The number of households served continues to grow. **Stop by Friday mornings between 10 and 12, you will see a room full of diverse people and hear multiple languages being spoken as people socialize, enjoy coffee, lemonade and muffins as they wait for their supplies.**

Our expanded and improved Community Garden will provide fresh garden-raised food for our Good Neighbors Personal Essentials Pantry guests and others.

The neighbor feels joy in donating something needed. New connections are formed at the Repair Café, and the Community Garden gets a much

needed rototiller to help produce fresh food for Essentials Pantry guests.

Restaurant Review: Tapatios Cocina Mexicana

Nestled in between Pick ‘N Save and Great Dane Fitchburg lies Tapatios, the real deal for Jalisco Mexican food here in Madison. When the owner, Daniel Hernandez, broke his back while working in construction, he and his wife Leticia decided to go into the food business. They started with a food truck before opening a restaurant. Since 2018, they have treated customers to friendly wait staff and a welcoming atmosphere.

From a two-sided menu, I went for the tacos, ordering al pastor (pork) and pollo asado (grilled chicken). However, I couldn’t keep my eyes from the other items. I ended up ordering a chorizo sope as well.

The food came out and my mouth immediately started watering. I squeezed my lime on my tacos and dug in. The al pastor was true to flavor, reddish from achiote with genuine pineapple and dried chili flavors. The grilled chicken was also

fantastic and paired nicely with a bottle of homemade salsa verde (honestly, I’d drink that stuff out of an old trash can, it’s so good).

Last, but not least, was the sope. A thick corn base topped with mounds of cilantro, onions, and chorizo. This dish went down fast. Before I knew it, the sope was in my stomach

and I was left smiling. Tapatios has announced that they are expanding into an adjacent space and will be able to host larger events and parties.
